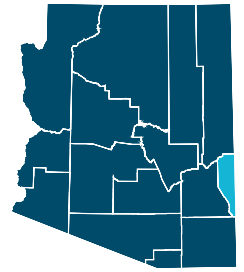


KIDS COUNT Databook | Greenlee County
