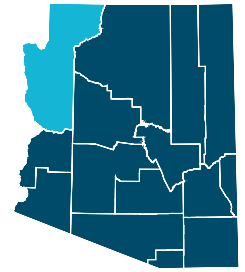


KIDS COUNT Databook | Mohave County
