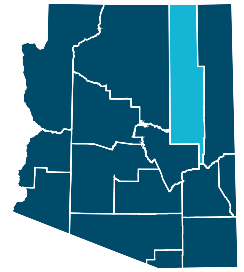


# KIDS COUNT Databook | Navajo County
