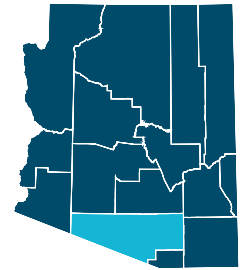


# KIDS COUNT Databook | Pima County
